- 9. Describe how Sjogrens, diverticula, lacerations, and hiatal hernia can contribute to swallowing dysfunction.
- 10. Explain what gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) is and the manifestations of this condition. Discuss Barrett's esophagus and Zollinger-Ellison syndrome.
- 11. Recall common treatments for gastroesophageal reflux disease. Explain what Helicobacter pylori is and how it causes gastritis
- 12. Explain the different types of ulcers and the common causes of ulcers.
