Comparison Operators

- Comparison operators compare two expressions.
- The result of a comparison results to true or false.
- Comparison operators are not case sensitive and are used with text and dates as well as numbers.

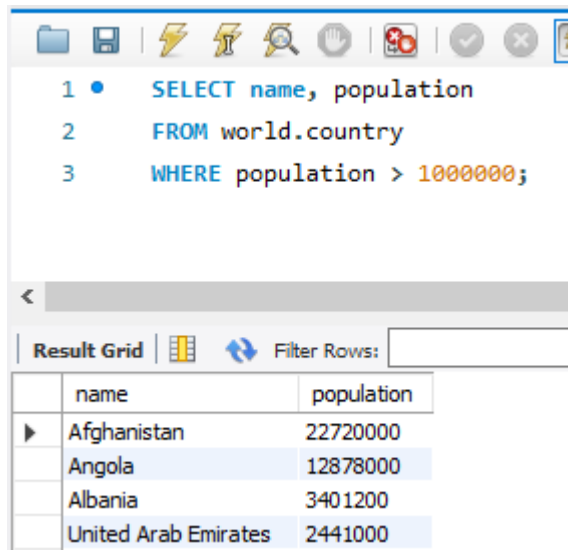
Table 5. Comparison Operators

Operator	Description
=	Equal
<	Less than
>	Greater than
<=	Less than or equal to
>=	Greater than or equal to
<>	Not equal
!=	Not equal

Example:

```
USE world;  
SELECT name, population  
FROM country  
WHERE population > 1000000;
```
